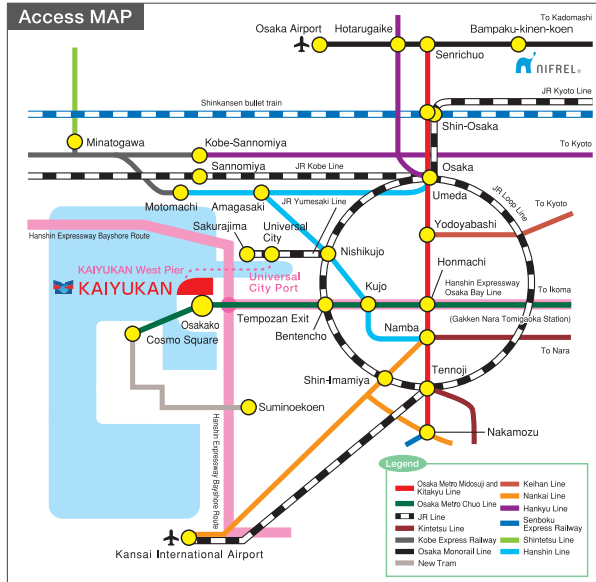

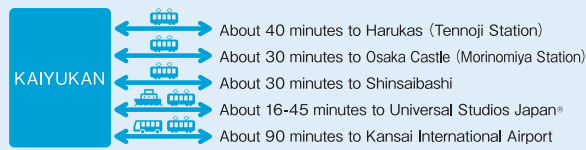


- **Aquarium Hours** / 10:00 a.m. ~ 8:00 p.m. (Last admission at 7:00 p.m.)

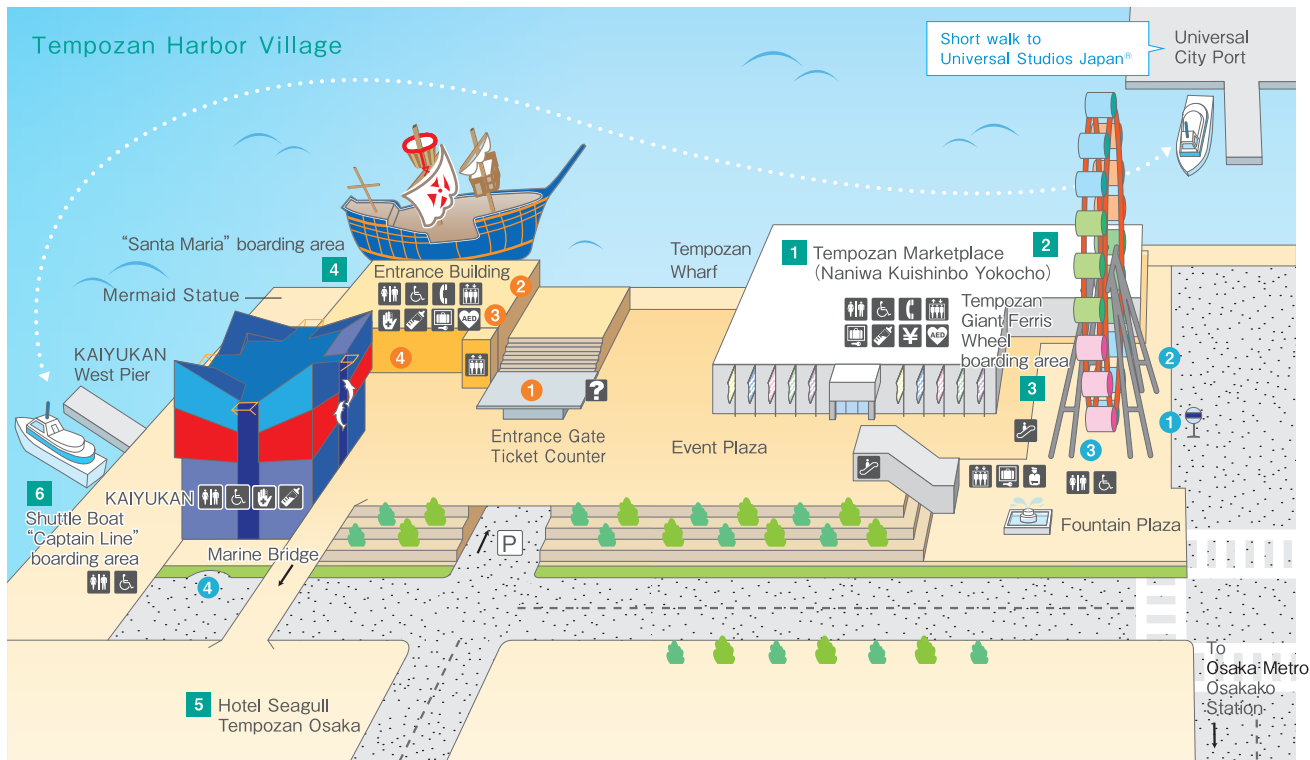

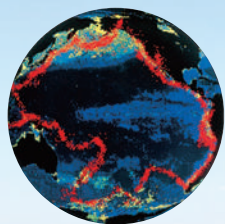

# Ring of Fire, Ring of Life.



The guiding principle of Kaiyukan is based on a theory, "The Gaia hypothesis" advocated by British scientist James Lovelock, which proposes that "all organisms and their inorganic surroundings on Earth are closely integrated to form a single and self-regulating complex system."

"The Ring of Fire" is the circum-Pacific volcano belt which surrounds the Pacific Ocean. It overlaps "The Ring of Life" with its high-density biodiversity. With the concepts suggested by these two "Rings", Kaiyukan recreates natural environment around the Pacific Ocean as faithfully as possible.

It is our sincere hope that all the visitors feel and reconsider the preciousness and wonder of life and the importance of nature environment all round us.

## Marine Animals of KAIYUKAN

### Aqua Gate

The tunnel-shaped tank makes you feel like literally walking underwater.

### 1 Japan Forest

The Japanese forest has its beauty for all four seasons.

Asian small-clawed otter, Japanese giant salamander, and more.

### 2 Aleutian Islands

The Aleutian chain lies in a bitterly harsh and frozen environment. The surrounding ocean waters, however, overflow with rich nutrients. This habitat supports a vast range of fish species, along with the tufted puffin and other hearty bird life. *The tufted puffin, and more*



### 3 Monterey Bay

Discover the life of California sea lions and Harbor seals on land and under water.

### 4 Gulf of Panama

Ring-tailed coatis climb up the trees skillfully and agilely while fish species of Panama swim in the Panamanian water.

### 5 Ecuador Rain Forest

The water of rain forest features Pirarucu, the largest freshwater fish in the world, and Capybara, the largest species of rodents in the world, and other diverse animal species and plants.

### 6 Antarctica

Penguins are swimming as if flying in the water of the south end of the earth.

### 7 Tasman Sea

Pacific white-sided dolphins, excellent jumpers of the Tasmanian sea, swim swiftly through the water. *Pacific white-sided dolphin*



### 8 Great Barrier Reef

The coral reefs are referred to as "the cradle of the ocean". How time flies while impressed by the beauty of the nature! *Species of Butterflyfish and Damselfish, and more.*



### 9 Pacific Ocean

The Pacific Ocean ---the largest ocean on earth. The huge Whale shark and other marine life swimming slowly and peacefully in the water create the vastness of water planet.

Whale shark, Scalloped hammerhead, Humphead wrasse, and more.

### 10 Seto Inland Sea

The Seto Inland Sea is located in western Japan. Let's search for Common octopuses resting behind rocks or Bastard halibuts lying still on the sea bed.

Barred knife jaw, Red seabream,  
Spiny lobster, and more.

### 11 Seasonal Exhibit

The marine life exhibited here varies from season to season (e.g., Bigfin reef squid). Recommended by our caretakers.

### 12 Coast of Chile

The giant school of Japanese anchovies emerges as a flowing sliver curtain - a true work of art created by mother nature.

### 13 Cook Strait

Loggerhead turtles swim beautifully using their fore-flippers shaped like paddles. Except when nesting females haul themselves onto a sandy beach, they stay submerged in water.

### 14 Japan Deep

This zone features Giant spider crab, the biggest crab in the world, and other mysterious forms of life of deep sea.

# 16 Arctic

Look up at the ice on the ceiling and meet Ringed seals smiling at you from the overhead dome tank. Feel the frigid Arctic while smelling the scent of Ringed seals and hearing them swimming among the ice using their flippers.



# 17 Falkland Islands(Malvinas)

Hear and smell the Rockhopper penguins living in their habitat reproduced here. Be amazed by the penguins swimming swiftly in the water or hopping around on the rocks, right before your eyes.

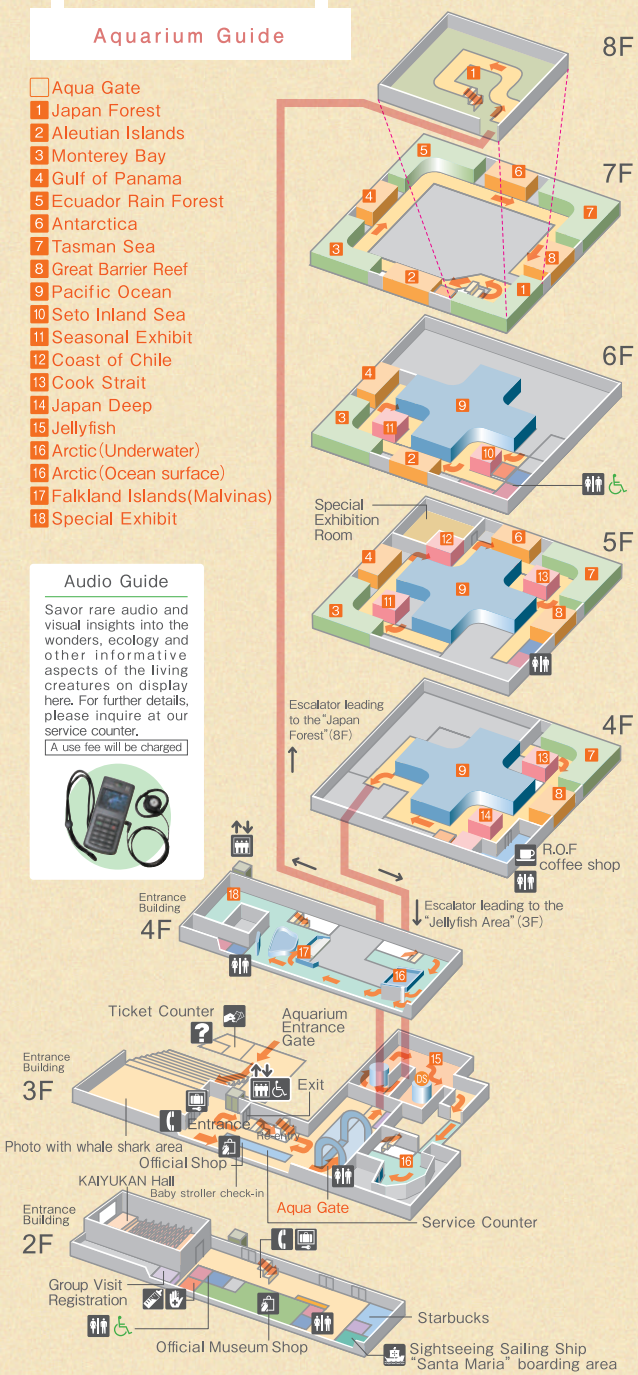
